DECA students in the WSD qualified for the state competitions to be held at the organization's State Career Development Conference in Kansas City, Missouri, on March 24-26. WSD high schools will be very well represented - with nearly 80 WSD students qualifying for the state competition (41 Timberland students, 26 from Holt, and 13 from Liberty). And what makes Timberland's large number even more amazing is that they had 48 students compete, so more than 85 percent of their participants qualified for state. Thirteen schools competed in the District 6 Regional Competition, participating in written tests and events, as well as simulations, in hopes of making it to state. If they advance from there, students will test their mettle against the rest of the world at the International Career Development Conference in Orlando, FL, April 26 - May 1.

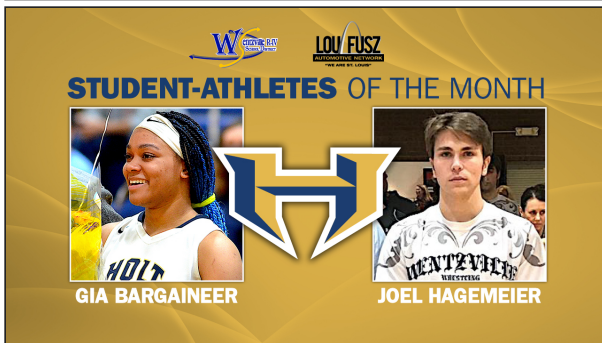

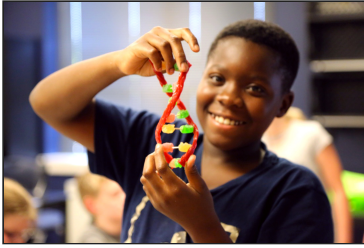
Heritage Propane School Days Program
