



- Only branch to offer in conjunction with Federal TA
- Can be used along with Montgomery GI Bill for the same classes.
- Can be used IMMEDIATELY after enlistment, even before Basic and AIT are completed
- Pays for Dual Credit Classes while still in High School
- Covers all major universities, and majority of community colleges and trade schools



ROTC SMP SIMULTANEOUS MEMBERSHIP PROGRAM

- Serve concurrently in the Army National Guard and ROTC
- Still qualify for full Federal/State TA and Montgomery GI Bill Selected Reserve benefits
- Eligible for additional Guaranteed Reserve Forces Duty (GFRD) scholarship along with Federal/State TA benefits
 - GFRD Scholarship pays \$10,000 per year room and board starting Junior/Senior years
- Non-deployable status while attending college
- Assignment into the Army National Guard as an officer upon commissioning and graduation



SHOW ME GOLD

- Serve concurrently in the Army National Guard and full-time at 4 select universities in Missouri:
 - Northwest Missouri State University (Maryville)
 - William Woods University (Fulton)
 - Missouri Southern State University (Joplin)
 - Southeast Missouri State University (Cape Girardeau)
- Qualify for full Federal/State Tuition Assistance and Montgomery GI Bill Selected Reserve benefits
