Social & Emotional Support at School

Wentzville School District's comprehensive school counselors provide a wide range of counseling, individual student planning and responsive services for students and are always the first line of support for any student who is struggling with personal issues. In addition, the district employs Educational Support Counselors (ESC's) who are assigned to our schools. ESC's provide specialized therapeutic services and consultation for students who exhibit social, emotional, or behavioral challenges which significantly interfere with school attendance, academics, or behavior.

The WSD also contracts with several community agencies for school-based counseling and classroom-based prevention programs. Agency professionals are fully credentialed by WSD, and work in our schools under the supervision of building Principals. Students may be referred to the school-based counseling programs by parents or school staff. For more information about agency services in any of our buildings, parents can contact the child's assigned school counselor.
